OUR MISSION



The Colored Pencil Project believes that art is the perfect way for children to communicate their experiences, hopes, and dreams.

As a non-profit organization, we aim to increase the access of art supplies to children in developing countries by distributing art supplies and administrating art workshops to children in various orphanages, schools and rural villages. Our international art workshops engage children in the power of self-expression.

By bringing the dreams belonging to these children back to the United States in the form of pictures. The Colored Pencil Project hopes to foster global understanding and goodwill through local art workshops and exhibits.

THE COLOR OF HOPE

Children need a voice. They need tools for expression, tools to tell their story.

The United States, which is home to just 4% of the world's population aged 5 to 25 years, accounts for more than one-quarter of the global education budget.

The United States spends almost as much as that of all governments in six regions combined: the Arab States, Central and Eastern Europe, Central Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, South and West Asia and sub-Saharan Africa.

Governments in sub-Saharan Africa spend only 2.4% of the world's education resources for 15% of the school age population.

According to estimates, the education budget of a single country like France, Germany or Italy outweighs the education expenditure in the entire sub-Saharan African region combined.
